## Halyna Yanchenkox Member of the Ukrainian Parliament



Halyna Yanchenko was elected to the Ukrainian Rada in 2019 and is the Deputy Chair of Sluha Narodu, SN (*Servant of the People*), a centrist, pro-European and anti-corruption party. In the Rada she serves as Deputy Chair of the Committee on Anti-Corruption Policy. Yanchenko is also the Secretary of the National Investment Council of Ukraine. President Zelensky tapped her to lead government anticorruption efforts in 2019, drawing on her extensive experience fighting against corruption in Ukraine. Yanchenko previously founded and chaired the anti-corruption

NGO "Anti-Corruption Headquarters", and led the Civil Oversight Council at the National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine. Halyna Yanchenko was a member of the Kyiv City Council from 2014-2015, and earned a Masters Degree in Sociology from the National University Kyiv-Mohyla Academy. She also studied for one year at the Wichita Falls High School in Texas.

## Sevhil Musaieva Editor-in-Chief of Ukrayinska Pravda



Sevhil Musaieva is a Ukrainian journalist from Crimea, currently serving as editor-in-chief of Ukraine's biggest online newspaper, *Ukrayinska Pravda*. Sevhil began her career as a journalist in 2007, and spent the following five years as a prominent Ukrainian business reporter for among other outlets — *Forbes Ukraine*, specializing in oligarchy-related investigations as well as reporting on corruption within the oil and gas industry. Following the start of the Euromaidan and Russia's annexation of Crimea, she launched the online media project *Krvm SOS*, where she

was chief editor. Sevhil Musaieva is a five-time winner of the "*Presszvanie*," a prize given to the best economic journalists in Ukraine. Additionally, Sevhil has been awarded the Anthony Moskalenko Memorial Award for "contribution to the development of Ukrainian journalism."
